Formative Assessment/key piece of work prior to end of unit:

- Each skill/technique task is assessed against the mark scheme.
- Formative assessment at end of each skills task will be an individual, extended piece of work.
- Peers will offer kind, specific and helpful comments upon which others can build.

Summative Assessment

- In Art, feedback is an ongoing process to encourage reviewing and refining of the outcome, prior to it being finally realized. Much feedback occurs throughout the lesson, as pupils are working creatively and independently.
- Pupils' progress is linked to the unit of work's outcomes success criteria. It acknowledges what they have achieved so far and how they can further improve.
